The Book of John

DID YOU KNOW?

Jesus was approximately 30-33 years old during the events recorded in the Gospel of John.

John wrote in his Book with the purpose of reaching unbelievers—emphasizing new life found in Jesus.

John emphasizes the identity of Jesus as the Son of God and how we, as believers, should respond to His teachings.

FUN FACTS

7 miracles – 6 of them are unique to the Book of John.

90% of John's material is unique to only the Book of John.

The word "life" appears a total of 36 times in the Book of John.

The shortest verse in the Bible is found in John 11:35, Jesus wept.

Did you know that God's word is made up of over 30,000 verses? And, of all those verses, John 3:16 is the one verse that has captured the attention of the world.

For this is how God loved the world: He gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life.

This verse has been printed on the bottom of shopping bags and around the rim of beverage cups. It's been painted on the side of monster trucks, added to signature lines, and googled over 94 million times when Tim Tebow painted it on his face before a televised football game.

But more than sporting events, fans, athletes, and celebrities this verse reminds us of the hope we have in Jesus. It's the story of the Gospel.

There is perhaps no other single verse that captures God's heart and His love for us in sending Jesus. It sets apart our God from the many other gods of this world. It's an invitation into a relationship and, at the core, the very essence of our faith.

Woman at the Well

We've seen it again and again—Jesus going against the grain. For the majority of His life, Jesus' behavior differs substantially from those around Him. Many of the things He did and said were considered to be counter cultural—especially to the Pharisees. The woman at the well is no exception. Throughout John 4, Jesus disrupts three major cultural elements:

Jesus speaks to a WOMAN

Jewish men did not address women in public (v. 27). Women were regarded as second-class citizens and many of their interactions were to be taken in private.

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Jesus speaks to a SAMARITAN WOMAN

Jews were to have no interactions with Samaritans (v. 9). They were believed to have betrayed their people and their nation.

Jesus speaks to an ADULTEROUS SAMARITAN WOMAN No respectable man would talk to a woman under such circumstances. Yet, we see Jesus speak freely with a woman taken in sin (v. 18).

Was it uncomfortable? Maybe. Was it worth it? Yes. We see the woman be given new life—hope and freedom in Jesus. She will never be thirsty again. She runs into her village and tells everyone to **come & see** a man who she believes could be the Messiah. JESUS SAID, "EVERYONE WHO DRINKS FROM THIS WATER WILL GET THIRSTY AGAIN. BUT WHOEVER DRINKS FROM THE WATER THAT I WILL GIVE HIM WILL NEVER GET THIRSTY AGAIN. IN FACT, THE WATER I WILL GIVE HIM WILL BECOME A WELL OF WATER SPRINGING UP IN HIM FOR ETERNAL LIFE."

Lazarus, Mary, & Martha

We've all been there—disaster strikes and we call upon God to help us. But what happens when help comes too late? Or even worse—it doesn't come at all? Mary, Martha, and Lazarus were close to Jesus, just outside of His inner circle of disciples. They were His closest friends. So, when Mary and Martha called upon Jesus to come and heal Lazarus, it's hard to understand why He didn't stop everything He was doing and come running. Because that's what friends do, right?

But Jesus had different plans. From the very moment He heard Lazarus was sick, Jesus was confident in the outcome. When Jesus got the news of His friend, He said, "Lazarus' sickness will not end in death but is for the glory of God, so that the Son of God will receive glory from this." (John 11:4)

His followers had seen Him heal plenty of people. They knew what He was capable of. But Jesus wanted His followers to experience something more. When Jesus finally arrives and Mary asks Jesus to **come & see** where they had laid Lazarus, we realize the wait wasn't for nothing.

Lazarus had to die so that Jesus' power over death could be shown. His death made it possible for Jesus to instill more faith in His people and lead them into God's glory. If Jesus had come sooner, they would have missed out on this incredible demonstration of love.

So, what are you waiting on God to do? Resist the urge to jump ahead of Him. He may want to perform miracles in your life.
